AN ACT

1 To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the
 2 Executive and Judicial Departments, the State Government
 3 Support Agencies and the General Assembly of the
 4 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the
 5 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for certain
 6 institutions and organizations and for the payment of bills
 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year
 8 ending June 30, 2018; to provide appropriations from the
 9 State Lottery Fund, the Tobacco Settlement Fund, the Aviation
 10 Restricted Account, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The
 11 State Stores Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home
 12 Investment Trust Fund, the Emergency Medical Services
 13 Operating Fund, the Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings
 14 Program Fund, the Banking Fund, the Firearm Records Check
 15 Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund,
 16 the Oil and Gas Lease Fund, the Home Improvement Account, the
 17 Cigarette Fire Safety and Firefighter Protection Act
 18 Enforcement Fund, the Insurance Regulation and Oversight
 19 Fund, the Pennsylvania Racehorse Development Restricted
 20 Receipt Account, the Justice Reinvestment Fund, the
 21 Multimodal Transportation Fund, the State Racing Fund and the
 22 ABLE Savings Program Fund to the Executive Department; to
 23 provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System
 24 Augmentation Account to the Judicial Department for the
 25 fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019; to provide
 26 appropriations from the Motor License Fund for the fiscal
 27 year July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019, for the proper operation
 28 of several departments of the Commonwealth and the
 29 Pennsylvania State Police authorized to spend Motor License
 30 Fund money; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds
 31 to the Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth
 32 and for the payment of bills remaining unpaid at the close of
 33 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018; and to provide for the
 34 additional appropriation of Federal and State funds from the
 35 General Fund, the State Lottery Fund and the Tobacco

1 Settlement Fund for the Executive and Judicial Departments of
2 the Commonwealth for the fiscal year July 1, 2017, to June
3 30, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining
4 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2017.

1 Section 2201. Effective date.

2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
3 hereby enacts as follows:

4 PART I

5 GENERAL PROVISIONS

6 Section 101. Short title.

7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
8 Appropriation Act of 2018.

9 Section 102. Definitions.

10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12 context clearly indicates otherwise:

13 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
14 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
15 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
16 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
17 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
18 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
19 other assistants in any department, board or commission.

20 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
21 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
22 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
23 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and
24 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
25 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
26 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
27 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
28 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
29 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
30 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment

1 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
2 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
3 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
4 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
5 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
6 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
7 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
8 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
9 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
10 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
11 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
12 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
13 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
14 hospital, provided, that in no case shall the State institution
15 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State
16 medical assistance program.

4 Section 104. State appropriations.

5 (a) General Fund.--The following sums set forth in this act,
6 or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically
7 appropriated from the General Fund to the several hereinafter
8 named agencies of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial
9 Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries,
10 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly
11 elected or appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth,
12 for the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for
13 the purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public
14 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and
15 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by
16 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the
17 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
18 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
19 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
20 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

21 (b) State Lottery Fund.--The following sums set forth in
22 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
23 specifically appropriated from the State Lottery Fund to the
24 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
25 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
26 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
27 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
28 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
29 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
30 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct

1 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
2 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
3 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
4 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

5 (c) Tobacco Settlement Fund.--The following sums set forth
6 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
7 specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to
8 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of
9 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
10 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
11 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
12 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
13 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
14 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
15 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
16 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
17 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
18 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

19 (d) Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account.--The
20 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
21 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
22 restricted receipt account established within the General Fund,
23 known as the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account, to
24 the Judicial Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of
25 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses, for
26 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the
27 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of
28 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary
29 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities
30 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year

1 beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred
2 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June
3 30, 2018.

4 (e) Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund.--The
5 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
6 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
7 Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund to the several
8 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
9 Commonwealth for the payment of fees for contractual services
10 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and
11 for the payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by
12 this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties,
13 functions and activities and for the purposes hereinafter set
14 forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, and for the
15 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of
16 the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

17 (f) The State Stores Fund.--The following sums set forth in
18 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
19 specifically appropriated from The State Stores Fund to the
20 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
21 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
22 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
23 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
24 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
25 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
26 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
27 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
28 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
29 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
30 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

1 (g) Motor License Fund.--The following sums, or as much
2 thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from the
3 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the
4 Executive Department for the payment of salaries, wages and
5 other compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or
6 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for
7 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper
8 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes
9 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
10 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
11 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

12 (h) Aviation Restricted Account.--The following sums, or as
13 much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from
14 the Aviation Restricted Account in the Motor License Fund to the
15 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the
16 purposes set forth herein for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
17 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
18 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

19 (i) Hazardous Material Response Fund.--The following sums
20 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,
21 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material
22 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the
23 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees
24 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
25 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
26 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
27 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
28 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
29 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
30 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

1 (j) Milk Marketing Fund.--The following sums set forth in
2 this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
3 specifically appropriated from the Milk Marketing Fund to the
4 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
5 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
6 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
7 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
8 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
9 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
10 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
11 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
12 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
13 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
14 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

15 (k) Home Investment Trust Fund.--The following sums set
16 forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are
17 hereby specifically appropriated from the Home Investment Trust
18 Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive
19 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries,
20 wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the duly
21 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the
22 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the
23 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of
24 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary
25 for the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities
26 and for the purposes hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year
27 beginning July 1, 2018, and for the payment of bills incurred
28 and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June
29 30, 2018.

30 (l) Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund.--The

1 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
2 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
3 Tuition Account Guaranteed Savings Program Fund to the
4 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
5 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
6 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
7 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
8 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
9 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
10 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
11 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
12 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

13 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
14 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
15 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

16 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
17 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
18 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
19 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
20 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
21 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
22 violence services.

23 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The
24 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
25 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
26 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
27 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
28 special health care needs and in providing health services for
29 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
30 care.

1 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-
2 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
3 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
4 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
5 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds
6 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds
7 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds
8 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.

9 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
10 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
11 persons.

12 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
13 Services Block Grant (MH SBG) provides funds for the provision of
14 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
15 serious emotional disturbance.

16 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
17 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
18 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

19 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child
20 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the
21 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and
22 availability of child care for low-income families.

23 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.--
24 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)
25 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,
26 training and support services, child welfare and administration
27 for eligible families and individuals.

28 Section 107. Appropriations to Pennsylvania Higher Education
29 Assistance Agency.

30 The appropriations set forth in this act to the Pennsylvania

1 Higher Education Assistance Agency, which is an integral part
2 and arm of the Commonwealth and which is directly controlled by
3 the Commonwealth, shall supplement other Commonwealth funds
4 maintained by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
5 Agency in order to fulfill its essential State governmental
6 function of providing Commonwealth students with access to
7 higher education opportunities and providing essential higher
8 education programs for the benefit of Commonwealth students.

19 include any prior earnings that may be received during fiscal
20 year 2018-2019. In addition to the amounts specifically
21 appropriated herein to the Department of Health and Human
22 Services, all money appropriated from the Federal Government
23 during any previous fiscal year which are expected to be
24 received as reimbursements may be carried forward until June 30,
25 2019, to the extent that obligations are carried forward. In
26 addition, any reimbursements actually received to support such
27 obligations may also be carried forward.

28 Section 2004. Subgrants between Federal fund appropriations.

29 Subgrants may be made between Federal appropriations without
30 further approval of the General Assembly. The Secretary of the

13 purposes prescribed by the Federal Government.

23 Pennsylvania Minority Business Development Authority Act.

15 receiving proceeds of Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general
16 obligation bonds in excess of the amount necessary for the
17 purposes for which the bonds were issued to the appropriate
18 sinking fund for payment of debt service due on outstanding
19 bonds. If such excess funds, together with any available
20 balance, exceed the amount of debt service remaining to be paid,
21 the funds shall be transferred to the General Fund or to the
22 appropriate special fund responsible for such debt service.

23 Section 2109. Transfers for government support agencies.

24 During fiscal year 2018-2019, any prior year amount
25 unexpended on the effective date of this section may, upon the
26 written concurrence of the President pro tempore of the Senate,
27 the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
28 Representatives and the Majority Leader of the House of
29 Representatives, be transferred between any of the following
30 accounts:

 - 14 (13) Pennsylvania Commission on Sentencing.
 - 15 (14) Host State Committee expenses - CSG.
 - 16 (15) Restricted Account for Leave Payout Expenses.
- 17 Section 2110. Transfers for Legislative Reapportionment
18 Commission.

19 The appropriation made in this act or in any other fiscal
20 year to the Legislative Reapportionment Commission remaining
21 unexpended and unencumbered on the effective date of this
22 section may, upon the written concurrence of the President pro
23 tempore of the Senate, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the
24 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Majority Leader
25 of the House of Representatives, be transferred to any other
26 account of the Senate and the House of Representatives, as they
27 deem necessary.

28 Section 2111. Administration of Human Services Block Grant.

29 The Department of Health and Human Services shall allocate
30 and disburse appropriations in this act for the Human Services

1 Block Grant Program established under Article XIV-B of the act
2 of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services
3 Code, to counties participating in that program. Each such
4 county may adjust the expenditure of its Human Services Block
5 Grant Program allocation between those appropriations in
6 accordance with, and as authorized by, the applicable provision
7 of Article XIV-B of the Human Services Code.

11 Section 2202. Effective date.

12 This act shall take effect as follows:
