1 Amending Title 44 (Law and Justice) of the Pennsylvania
2 Consolidated Statutes, providing for actions by law
3 enforcement.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

1 § 9101. Prohibition.

2 (a) General rule.--Notwithstanding 18 Pa.C.S. § 508
3 (relating to use of force in law enforcement) and except as
4 provided under subsection (b), in making an arrest a
5 Pennsylvania State Police officer or municipal police officer:

6 (1) May not:

7 (i) apply the use of a chokehold;

8 (ii) apply any pressure to the diaphragm, airways or
9 any compression that inhibits breath or the flow of blood
10 to the brain of the person; or

11 (iii) hold the person in prone restraint or facedown
12 while restrained for a period of time exceeding three
13 minutes or as practical as to avoid positional asphyxia.

14 (2) May not keep the person in prone restraint or a
15 facedown position once the person is restrained.

16 (b) Application.--The prohibitions under subsection (a)
17 shall not apply when the use of deadly force is permitted under
18 law.

19 (c) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
20 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
21 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

22 "Prone restraint." All items or measures used to restrain a
23 person in a facedown position.

24 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
